Dear Mrs. Woods:

This is to advise you that Mr. David Aven is under my care.

Mr. Aven began treatment on June 26, 2013 upon the recommendation of his family physician. He for sometime has been under marked emotional stress centered round his dealing as a real estate manager in St. Jose, Costa Rica. He is involved in a group who are trying to develop land in the west part of Costa Rica near the Pacific Ocean. Apparently permission was obtained. He later found the development was not authorized to proceed because of "environmental" problem. He feels that the new request created significant problem and because he did not "oil" their process, he has been the object of many problems.

He claimed he has had an attempt on his life which led him to leave Costa Rica and he came back to the States and has been living in Florida but also in Pennsylvania. He has experienced significant anxiety, apprehension, and fear manifested by the sensation of shortness of breath, feeling of unsteady, having pervasive anxiety, restless, difficulties in concentrating and being irritable. He claimed that he had an attempt against his life and that there has been many goings and threats through e-mail and the internet which seriously has affected his wellbeing. Indeed he lived in a constant state of anxiety and apprehension.

We began to treat him with supportive management and the use of psychotropic medication which has ameliorated some of his anxiety and apprehension. Yet he still has many symptoms and what it appeared now that he has dreams of frightened nature which have not been before. He has experienced also marked anxiety, apprehension, and has become suspicious and fearful of others. He feels that he is no longer a "free person," that he needs to be cautious about what he does, where he eats because there are too many things going on. Things are complicated too


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Mr. Aven is cooperative with care. He is following treatment recommendations well. He in addition to being seen by the undersigned, he is being treated by his medical doctor. As mentioned, he is alert, oriented but has difficulties in concentrating. He is anxious and fearful. He is worried about things are going in term of his wellbeing. He is discussing these issues with the undersigned.

Though the treatment is ameliorating some of his symptoms it seems that the ongoing legal situation is seriously interfering with his well being. He could well develop a chronic state of anxiety which would require long term care.
